1. About the UK Young Academy

The UK Young Academy is a new interdisciplinary organisation of UK-based early-career researchers, innovators and professionals from across society who share a passion to improve our world.

As part of a global initiative of Young Academies, we will give a voice to individuals with ideas, initiative and drive who wish to work together to contribute to national and global decision-making.

2. Applying for membership

The UK Young Academy is welcoming applications for its first members. We are looking for dedicated, driven and dynamic individuals who are committed to collaborating with others from a spectrum of different sectors.

Our members will be selected from across the UK, from a variety of diverse backgrounds and a range of experiences. They will be at the forefront of their field, having demonstrated excellence, leadership skills and creative and innovative thinking. Suggestions for what this may look like in practice can be found in the eligibility criteria section below.

Members will be encouraged to help define the UK Young Academy's activities and contribute to its projects. They will help to build the UK Young Academy's reputation and give it a credible voice on

issues that matter. This will include engaging with fellow members and other institutions to understand the key issues facing society and pressing for best practice across the sectors they represent. Members will have the opportunity to address challenges faced by their peers, inform national and international policy, and enable positive societal change.

Members will typically be for five years, and there is no membership fee. Travel and accommodation costs will be supported to facilitate participation in UK Young Academy activities for all members and additional support is also available to help cover the costs of childcare.

3. Eligibility criteria

You'll be in the early stages of a professional career

We are looking for forward thinking, innovative and proactive individuals in all key sectors of society. While not an exhaustive list, these might include entrepreneurs, researchers in academia or industry, engineers, professionals in the arts and creative industries, lawyers, teachers, clinicians, along with individuals working in new and emerging fields.

You'll have approximately 3-12 years' experience in your field

Those eligible to apply will be in the early stages of their careers. As a guide, members may typically have at least three to twelve years of experience working in their profession or post highest qualification or degree. We expect to welcome members from their mid-20s to their mid-40s, however this is just a guideline. If you are early in your career and meet the selection criteria, you will be considered, regardless of age. We also appreciate that career paths can take many twists and turns. When reviewing applicants' eligibility, documented career breaks (including parental leave, adoptive leave or extended sick leave) will be taken into consideration, and the 12-year upper limit should be considered to extend as appropriate to account for any breaks in career.

You must reside in the UK

Members will be selected from anywhere in the UK and from all backgrounds. Applicants will typically be UK citizens or live in the UK when you apply for membership, unless you have exceptional circumstances such as if you are a refugee or asylum seeker and are currently residing in the UK.

You'll have a track record of excellence

Members will be selected for their career excellence. Perhaps you've made a significant contribution to your field, won awards, or led a team to deliver an important new project. Your commitment and possible contribution to the UK Young Academy will also be important.

We would encourage you to apply, even if you think you might not fit all the eligibility criteria. If you see yourself as early-career and are passionate about our aims, we want to hear from you.

4. The selection process

Applications for the UK Young Academy's first members will be reviewed by the Appointments Committee, which comprises individuals including Fellows and Members from the seven partner academies and early-career and professional sector representatives covering different areas of knowledge, expertise and geography. Applications will be scored using the selection criteria outlined below to select the first cohort of members. The Appointments Committee may invite applicants for a short interview as part of the selection process.

Timeline for the selection process:

8 September 2022:	Deadline for applications
September – November 2022:	Review of applications by the Appointments Committee
16 – 18 November 2022:	Possible applicant interviews
December 2022:	Applicants will be contacted about application outcome

As part of the selection process, we ask you to submit a short supporting video. This video will give you opportunity to talk about a topic or issue that you are passionate about and why it might make a

good project as part of the UK Young Academy's new work programme. The Appointments Committee are looking for you to demonstrate your enthusiasm and interest, as well as your ability to communicate a topic of interest succinctly within the limit of a 3-minute video.

5. Selection criteria

The application form consists of three main sections that cover an applicant's career (50%), a personal statement (25%) and how they feel they will contribute to the UK Young Academy (25%). Applicants are asked to use these sections to demonstrate evidence of outstanding professional achievement, together with other relevant skills, interests and experience they might have.

This may include:

- Involvement in innovation and entrepreneurial activity
- Interdisciplinary working
- Interest in both global and national professional and societal policy issues
- Interest or participation in international collaboration

Alongside the evidence listed above, the Appointments Committee are also looking for broader skills and experience that demonstrate a passion for working with others; a capacity for leadership; interest in wider societal issues and a flair for innovative and creative thinking.

6. Referees

As part of the application process, we ask you to submit two references to support your application. Once you insert your referee details via the application form, they will automatically be contacted to provide supporting statements for your application.

Please ensure that you have already approached your nominated references beforehand to check that they are happy to provide a statement and informed them that they will be contacted by email to complete the referee form via the application portal.

Referees will need to submit their supporting statements by the application closing date of Thursday 8 September 2022 and it is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure this part of the process has been completed.

Applications which have not been fully completed by the closing date may be deemed incomplete and not progressed for review.

7. Use of data

The UK Young Academy is operating under the auspices of the Royal Society in first instance.

Please note that information regarding your application may be shared with the UK Young Academy the Royal Society, and relevant partner academies, and the Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy (BEIS) for data monitoring and evaluation purposes.

You may also be contacted by the UK Young Academy, the Royal Society or an agent acting on their behalf, for reporting and evaluation purposes throughout the course of your membership and after completion of your term.

Title, Name, Home address and Current post and organisation*	Review and complete your personal details accurately. Errors in this section can cause difficulties in processing your application.
Email address*	This field will be used to create your application submission and should be prepopulated from the email you use to register for the application portal. All correspondence pertaining to your application will be sent to this address throughout the course of the application process.
Which sector(s) would you place yourself in?*	Select from the list which sector/s you most closely identify with in your primary role. Note, this question is for internal use only to support with the reviewing process.

	Even if your sector is not listed, please try and indicate the most relevant option. You are able to select multiple options.
Career History*	Provide job title, organisation, date from and to and a brief overview of your main responsibilities and achievements for each position. You can create a new line on the table by clicking 'Add'. A pop up with the fields outlined above will appear. Note that your application may be reviewed by individuals from outside your field of work. Therefore, please avoid jargon, and use accessible language that is understandable for a non-specialist in your area of work.
Degree(s)	List any degrees you hold here.
Professional Qualifications / Membership of Professional Bodies	List any professional qualifications you hold or memberships to professional bodies here.
Do you consider your primary role to sit within academia, private sector, charity or other?	Tick which sector your primary role sits within.

SECTION 2: Personal Statement	
Personal Statement*	Please provide a personal statement about your motivations for wishing to join the UK Young Academy. Here we are looking for you to provide relevant evidence, experience or enthusiasm for how you meet the selection criteria. Plain text only maximum of 500 words.
Please provide evidence of leadership, responsibility and recognition within your main area of work*	In this question, we are looking for you to demonstrate how you fit into the remit of an 'emerging leader'. This could be examples of leadership responsibility you have within your main role, or existing recognition within your main area of work. Please note that your application may be reviewed by individuals outside your field, and you should therefore provide context and explanation for any achievements that are niche to your field of expertise or work. Plain text only maximum of 500 words.
Please provide evidence of interest, contributions or recognition outside your main area of work*	Here we are looking for evidence of or interest in cross-disciplinary activities and this could include public and charitable service, outreach, public engagement or community-based project work. Examples should be from outside your main area of work. Plain text only maximum of 500 words.

SECTION 3: Your vision and commitment to the UK Young Academy	
Provide a web link to a short video outlining:	Here we ask you to submit a link to a short video. Videos should be <u>no longer</u> than 3 minutes in length. Applications containing videos over this time limit may be deemed ineligible.

<p>A topic, issue or subject area that interests you, that could be an area for consideration for the UK Young Academy's work programme?*</p>	<p>Submitted videos do not need to be a polished product and can be simply filmed using your smart phone or tablet. However, please ensure your image is clear and the sound is audible.</p> <p>Note, we do not want you to submit the raw video file. Videos should first be hosted on a video hosting site such as YouTube or Vimeo and the link provided in your application form. We would recommend uploading your video as unlisted (so it is not publicly accessible) and without a password if possible, which will help the review process.</p> <p>Further guidance on submitting a video, including some useful tips for filming and suggestions for video hosting sites can be found in our guidance on how to make a good video.</p> <p>If you are unable or uncomfortable to complete the video as part of your submission, we do offer alternatives for this part of the application process. If selected, how will you prioritise your commitment to the UK Young Academy and its work programmes?*</p>	<p>Selecting committed individuals who will be active members is an integral part of ensuring the UK Young Academy's first few years are as productive as possible with valuable outputs.</p> <p>We would like to hear how, if selected, you will ensure you can commit to the UK Young Academy and its work programmes alongside your other commitments. For example, this could be securing support from your organisation to be involved.</p> <p>Plain text only maximum of 300 words.</p>
<p>Please indicate you can commit the minimum time commitment to the UK Young Academy*</p>	<p>Please tick to confirm you can accommodate the minimum time commitment required to engage in the UK Young Academy activities which is typically 4-5 hours per month.</p> <p>We will also expect all successful applicants to attend the New Members Induction Meeting which will take place on 24 - 25 January 2023 in London.</p> <p>Once the first group of members has been selected, there will be optional leadership opportunities available which may require additional time commitment.</p>
